

Industrial Design - M.I.D.

The department offers the graduate Master of Industrial Design accredited by the National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD).

The applicant must have a bachelor's degree in industrial design or its equivalent from an institution of recognized standing.

Applicants with baccalaureate degrees from other disciplines may be admitted to the graduate program under condition that a minimum of 43 post baccalaureate credit hours in industrial design be completed at the undergraduate level with a 3.0 grade-point average. Students without an undergraduate Industrial Design degree are admitted during the summer semester.

Upon admission to the master's program successful completion of 35 graduate level credit hours, including a thesis is required. A 40 credit hour non-thesis option is available. Credit for INDD 7990 may not exceed six hours.

The curriculum may be structured to accommodate the student's area of interest. In certain cases, additional course work beyond the minimum may be required. There is no language requirement.

A 12 credit graduate-level core curriculum and terminal document draft review are required. Students are admitted only in the summer and fall semesters. Applications to the graduate program must be complete by April 1.
